Maths: Finishing Fractions A: adding and subtracting fractions (inc. mixed numbers). **Multiplication and Division:** 4 x 1 digit, 2 x 2 digit, 3 x 2 digit, 4 x 2 digit, 2 divided by 1 digit, 3 divided by 1 digit. **Fractions B:** x unit, non unit and mixed numbers by integers, fractions of quantities and amounts, finding the whole, fractions as operators. **Decimals and percentages:** Decimals up to 2 d.p, decimals as fractions, Thousandths as decimals, rounding decimals, order and compare decimals, understanding %, % as fractions and decimals, equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. **Perimeter and Area:** rectangles, rectilinear shapes, polygons and compound shapes. **Statistics:** Draw, read and interpret line graphs, tables, 2 way tables and timetables.

At home you can: Repeatedly practise Multiplication tables and related division facts - a secure grasp is very important for Fractions work. Look for examples of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages in everyday life.

Science

Finishing Changes of Materials, Forces and Earth and Space

At home you can:

Look at forces at work in the home, observe the moon in the sky, look out for 'space' news.

Geography

Mountains: what are they, key features, how they are formed, types, climate, mountain life, location of UK's highest mountains, the Himalayas.

At home you can look at books about mountains, or watch programmes about them, find mountainous regions on a map. Talk about what it would

RE

Judaism and Christianity: Celebrations related to Key figures: Esther and Purim, Moses and Passover, Jesus and Easter.

At home you can discuss what the children have been learning, find out some more about the festivals. Discuss any similarities between these and those from other faiths.

Art

Finishing printing (collagraph print) , Still life: (drawing and painting, colour, single line drawing, carbon copy printing. Pattern

At home you can look at examples of still life work, discuss what you like or dislike, practise collecting and drawing objects around the house.

French

Learning to say the date and to describe my home.

At home you can practise saying the date in French and labelling rooms in the home.

PSHE

Celebrating difference, Dreams and Goals, Relationships

At home you can

Talk about what is important to you as a family, celebrate how you are different and discuss hopes and dreams.

Digital Photography

At home you can

Talk to your children about keeping safe when using the internet

Encourage the children to use a digital camera to take photos.

At home you can carry out extra research about these topics and watch programmes—the BBC website is great for this.

PE

At home you can: practise what you have learned.

D & T (after half term)

Designing and making a couscous salad. Tasting various types of couscous, plain and packet. Thinking about what can be added for taste and texture. Designing own recipe and making.

At home you can: practise using a knife and vegetable peeler safely, talk about food hygiene and eat couscous!

Music

Learning how to play the p-bone (mini plastic trombone) how to make a sound, different notes, following a conductor.

At home you can find out about different brass instruments, listen to pieces of music played on brass instruments. Can you find pbone videos?
